## RESOLUTION

**Recommendations of Change in the Passing Standard for Undergraduate (UG) & Postgraduate (PG) programmes to be implemented from academic year 2022-2023, progressively; as recommended in the 12<sup>th</sup> Academic Council meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2021 & approved in the 9<sup>th</sup> Governing Body meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> October 2021.**

Referring to above, it was resolved to implement No ATKT (allowed to keep terms) for students from academic year 2022-2023, progressively, for enhancing quality of education. The rule specifically points out that-

### **“For Undergraduate programs-**

A learner who has failed to pass in one or more subjects, in the respective year of the program i.e. two semesters taken together, after the re-examination (i.e. odd semester re-examination after the results declaration of odd semester regular examination and even semester re-examination after the result declaration of even semester regular examinations) will not be permitted to apply for admission and to continue to the next year of the program. Such learners will be required to appear for the re-examination of the courses in which they have failed to pass. They will appear for the re-examination to be conducted for the regular learners of the subsequent batch. Such a learner will also have an option to take re-admission in the same year of the program, which he/she failed to pass subject to the validity of the program.

### **For Postgraduate programs-**

A learner who has failed to pass in one or more subjects, in the respective year of the program i.e. two semesters taken together, after the re-examination (i.e. odd semester re-examination after the results declaration of odd semester regular examination and even semester re-examination after the result declaration of even semester regular examinations) will not be permitted to apply for admission and to continue to the next year of the program. Such learners will be required to appear for the re-examination of the courses in which they have failed to pass. They will appear for the re-examination to be conducted for the regular learners of the subsequent batch. Such a learner will also have an option to take re-admission in the same year of the program, which he/she failed to pass subject to the validity of the program.”
